FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Holy Week Worship Services

Come join us for the special worship services leading up to our Resurrection Celebration.

April 2, Palm Sunday, 10:30 AM. We will have one combined worship service in the Main Sanctuary at 10:30. Children will march in with Palm branches. It will be a great celebration. After church, we will have dinner on the grounds with lots of activities for children. Invite all you know to join us!



April 6, Maundy Thursday Service, 6:30 PM. We will celebrate Holy Communion as we remember the last supper in the Upper Room.

April 7, Good Friday Service, 6:30 PM. Our worship service this year will be a Tenebrae service of shadows. This is honestly one of the most moving worship services you might attend. I encourage all to journey to the cross with us in worship.

April 9, Easter Sunday, 8:30, 9:45, 11 AM. We will hold our three regular worship services. Be sure and invite a friend. This is a great opportunity for evangelism. Many would be open to attending worship with you on this special day.

The Ministerial Association of Crestview will also hold a sunrise service in Old Spanish Trail Park at 6:30 AM.

Disaffiliation Report

On March 12, our congregation voted 93% to Disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. We voted 98% to join the Global Methodist Church. We also voted 85% to go back to our name of "First Methodist Church" (our name from 1939-1968).

There are a few more steps and all will not be complete until the whole Annual Conference votes on May 7. If approved, the name and denominational affiliation change would take effect on Sunday night, May 7. We will report events as they happen on our Facebook page.

If approved, there will be a lot of work for many volunteer hands. Signs will need to begin changing, new name tags created, and a whole lot more. There will be work inside and outside. I encourage you to look for ways to help.

We are still taking donations for our Disaffiliation Fund if you'd like to make a contribution. You can do that through our fumcrestview app or notate your check with 'Disaffiliation'.

Our first Sunday as a GMC church will be May 14 (Mother's Day). Then, on May 21, we will have a special New Covenant Day (one combined service at 10:30 in the Main Sanctuary) where we will all renew our membership vows. I have already been asked: what about a shut-in or someone away at college who cannot be here that day but wants to continue being a member of our congregation? It is not a mandatory meeting. Instead, please think of this as a great moment in the long journey of our church history. We are planning a big service that day and I hope you will join us. Also, this will be the first day in a while that we receive new members.

On a personal note, I will share that this has been a season of mixed emotions for me. I have been a part of the United Methodist Church since its formation in 1968 and I have given over 40 years of my life to her from the moment God called me into full-time ministry in November of 1982. For 40 years I have been working for reform. It was a hard decision for me personally to come to the point where I felt God moving me in a different direction. On the day of our disaffiliation vote, more than one person told me it was a day of joy and grief. I know what they mean.

I grieve that issues in the UMC have become so grave. I also grieve over the loss of church members and friends who did not feel they could travel this path with us. Make no mistake, this is a time of loss in our church. We should name it and not hide it.

But it's also a hopeful time- even a time of joy. I know several people who shed tears of genuine joy because of the new path we are now on. They felt a sense of relief because they could more faithfully serve God in a new setting. There is an excitement for the days ahead. We believe there will be greater freedom to do the ministry God has called us to do. Will there challenging days ahead? Sure. But many people believe that there are signs of a revival that are just beginning to sweep our land and we want to be a part of it- something people have been praying about for decades.

New Members

If you are interested in learning more about what it means to be a full member, please make that notation on a Grace Note and drop it in the offering plate at worship. There are already 6-10 people who have communicated to me they

were waiting to see which way our vote went and are now eagerly looking forward to explore full membership.

Membership Transfer

And lastly, if you are one of those that wants to stay UMC and not join the Global Methodist Church, please let us know in the church office. We can transfer your membership to the Pensacola District Roll. Since every UMC church within almost 30 miles is disaffiliating. I am pretty certain Bishop Graves and the Pensacola District will want to plant a new UMC church in the Crestview area one day (for example, they have already planted one in Pace, Florida). Having your name on the District Roll will provide Conference leaders with a pool of people for planting this new congregation.

If you join another church here or elsewhere, or even simply want your name removed, please let us know.

Let me say, that while I know some folks were disappointed with the vote, we still hope you will continue on this journey of faith with us. Our name is simply returning back to our old name and we will have a new denominational affiliation. However, the core of who we are is not changing. In many ways, this will be the same congregation where you have worshiped for years. We would love to continue this journey together for many more years to come.

My hope is built on nothing less Than Jesus blood and righteousness.

Childrens Ministry

PALM SUNDAY SERVICE AND EASTER EGG HUNT

April 2, 2023 we will celebrate Palm Sunday in a combined service at 10:30AM and then have our annual Palm Sunday Event on Alabama Street and a light lunch.

The children will meet in the front of the church Sanctuary at 10:15 am for the procession of the palms. The following is a schedule of the days events and some announcements for all.

- Kids' Street open at 9:15am, 6wks—5th grade
- Kids Sunday School—9:30am to 10:15am
- Kids will line up at 10:15am to carry the palms into the Sanctuary.
- Children's Church—10:45am to 11:30am
- Lunch served at 11:40 am outside of the Christ Chapel (Alabama Street)

Children's activities begin at noon with games, face painting, bounce house and our annual Easter Egg Hunt (bring your basket)! All children are to be accompanied by a parent/guardian at all times during this event.

Volunteers: Kids Street needs you! We would love to have more volunteers on Wednesday nights and for our special events. See Angela Long or any Children's Ministry Team Member for more information.

Seedbed Curriculum: Our children have had a blast in the 11:00 Chapel Time and on Wednesday nights this month. They have begun Seedbed Kids curriculum where they are focusing on becoming Trackers to a Life of Discipleship. Trackers is a program designed to develop the basics of Christianity in our children, instilling in them a knowledge of where truth is found, examples of Biblical "Trackers of Truth," and a desire to seek truth for themselves.

Using a mixed agriculture and time-travel theme, the children will go through the Old Testament in chronological order, learning many highlights of the Old Testament stories. At the same time, they will learn of the many glimpses of the coming Savior, as revealed in the New Testament. They will soon understand that in the Old Testament, Jesus was present but concealed, whereas in the New Testament, Jesus was revealed. Each week, the children will also learn practical lessons of personal application to assist them in their own spiritual growth. Kids Street Trackers began the study on the Life of Discipleship session and will be focusing on this for 10 or more weeks. The first two modules over view is as follows to give you an idea of what we will be exploring. **Trackers of Discipleship Module One**: Who is God? The children will discuss God is Trinity, God is Father, God is Son, and God is Holy Spirit. **Module Two**: Word of God: The Big Story, Loving God's Word, and The Power of God's Word.

VBS Dates are **June 19 to June 23**. We will have a day session for preschool age children and evening session for K to 5th graders. Registration is now open at fumcrestview.com. for Preschool, K to 5th Grade and Adult Volunteers.

We are excited to announce that this year we will serve a light meal during our evening snack time to help out with the late night requests for a second meal when your children get home!

Palm Sunday Song & Procession Practice: We are practicing for our Palm Sunday procession on Wednesday night and at the 11:00 Service. Kevin Lusk has been rehearsing with the children so they can join the choir in praise as we enter the church on Palm Sunday. 


