## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### **Welcome**

I spoke to someone yesterday who I once pastored in another city. He was telling me about his current church. I asked how things were going. He said he and his wife liked it overall, but "those are not the friendliest people in the world." He said that he and his wife attended there for almost a year before anyone spoke to them. And even still, they've been attending now for about two years and very few people speak to them.



Notice: They liked the preacher, but they attend in spite of the people.

That's not a good combination- and most people don't stick around as long as they have (his wife wants to stay, but he's ready to look elsewhere). You need both in a healthy church: good preaching with pastoral leadership and a community of faith who love and care for one another.

It reminded me of a time when I was the guest preacher at a church in Florida. There were no ushers. There were no greeters at the doors. Bulletins were only laying on a table. I was in the pastor's office and my sweet wife went to the entrance of the church. All the doors were shut (it was a mild sunny day, not summer), the lights were out in the foyer, no one was greeting anyone, and a small group of men were sitting in the foyer talking. They watched as Melanie opened the doors, turned the lights on, and started greeting people herself as they walked in (remember, she herself was a visitor!). Instead of being thankful, those men actually got mad at her! Needless to say, this was not a healthy church.

I've wanted to share some things with our congregation for a while, and this conversation with my former parishioner yesterday brought it to my mind.

This is a welcoming church! It is one of our strengths. I often brag about you in the community! When inviting people to come and worship with us, I even sometimes dare them to see if they can get in the door on time and then leave with no one speaking to them. I say, I don't think it will happen but I want to know if it does! I am so grateful to walk in on a Sunday morning and see people getting out of their seats and greeting each other and be welcoming- especially to people you don't recognize. This is a powerful ministry. And this is especially true since we have such a large number of first time visitors at our church.

But there are three dangers I wanted to highlight for you.

- 1. <u>Don't only greet those you know.</u> I once served a church that appeared to be one of the friendliest churches I have served. People hugged and greeted in a strong fashion each week. I say "appeared" because after a month or two, it somehow occurred to me that they were warmly greeting <u>each other</u>. However, if you were new, you got ignored. And I realized this was actually a cold churchif you were <u>new</u>. It took a lot of work to break that pattern.

  One principle that we should all follow is: **Strangers before Good Friends**. Before worship, or during a greeting time, and after the last Amen, always seek out those who you <u>don't</u> recognize first- especially within about 10 feet of you. Welcome them and (even better) learn their names. Then, after you have given your attention to someone new, then you may greet your good friends.
- 2. When the Pastor might say, "Turn and greet one another" during the worship service, this can be a particularly difficult moment. Because people do not sit evenly spaced in worship, there can be pockets where someone is sitting and there is no one present for about 10 feet or more. Standing up front, I have seen people at this church (especially newcomers) at that moment in the service: they turn left, they turn right, forward and back, they look around and see no one to speak to, and some just sit down. It can be very awkward and disappointing.

As a church member, please be aware of this situation. Get up out of your seat and quickly move to someone like that. I was visiting a church in Richmond, Virginia, and at that moment in the service, a lady 3 rows back on the opposite side of the church, crossed the aisle, came forward and greeted my family. I was very impressed.

3. **Don't only eat with people you know**. It is good to enjoy a meal with friends. Absolutely. But imagine visiting a church, coming to your first or second Community Dinner, and you and your spouse sit at a table <u>alone</u>. No one asks to join you, and no one asked you to come join their table. Meal times can be particularly <u>lonely</u> times for visitors because many are quick to greet newcomers in worship, but not so quick to eat with them.

You have the power to grow or harm a church. Remember: if all visitors cared about was preaching or listening to the choir special, then they would watch online. By coming to an actual worship service, they are seeking something more. They are seeking a community- a place to belong .... with <u>YOU</u>.

Everyone is invited to a very special youth led Discovery Candlelit Prayer Service on Saturday, **April 6** at 7:00PM in the Main Sanctuary.




## **Discovery Sunday**
