Benevolence Ministry

I thought Covid 19 would wipe out Benevolence funds this year. Thanks to the generous donations we have continued receiving all year we were able to be generous helping with utility bills.

In the first 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ months of 2020 we helped 13 families with \$8287 to pay their bills. We also gave out about 50 bags of food.



When we were able to start up again at the end of June we had a lot of people calling for help. From June until December we helped 74 people with utility bills giving out \$24,588. At Thanksgiving we helped 26 families with food boxes. The Angel Tree made 57 children's Christmas brighter thanks again to the generosity of our congregation.

Over the last 6 months we gave out 350 bags of food. Benevolence had two new people come on the team, Eileen Kurtz and Kristen Sallberg, who have been a great help in helping so many families.

We look forward to 2021, praying for a better year for everyone.


