FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK


A Heart Overflowing with Gratitude

Please note: there is new information that was published only a few weeks ago, so be sure and check out the three large boxes at the bottom of the document. I especially ask that you check out "The Post Jurisdictional Update on the United Methodist Church". Some of you will find the information shocking and disturbing.

From the first day this topic came up, I have encouraged you to be knowledgeable on this topic by doing research and participating. One of the most disappointing things that is happening all across the country is that some people are showing up for a final disaffiliation vote and they have attended no meetings and read nothing. Please don't do this. There is plenty of information on our website where you can explore reasons for and against disaffiliation.

Our Administrative Council has voted unanimously to move forward with disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church. The date for our church vote has been set for Sunday, March 12 and you will want to mark that date down so you can be present. More information like the exact time of arrival, doors closed, procedures, etc will be shared in the future.

Last Townhall Meeting: Feb 19 at 3 pm in the Main Sanctuary



We will have one more Townhall gathering. The agenda includes the following. We will hear reports on the financial plan (including the final Disaffiliation costs). The Long Range Planning Committee will present their report about new name and logo possibilities should disaffiliation pass. We will take a vote at this meeting to narrow the name choices down and all members are encouraged to participate. Of course questions may be asked as well.

Benevolence Ministry 12 Days of Christmas


Let's celebrate the 12 Days of Christmas and restock our Benevolence Pantry together!

Benevolence Christmas Report



We need to listen to what God told Joshua about 3,400 years ago. As Joshua was about to lead God's people into the promised land, he had reason to be afraid.
