From the Pastor's Desk

To Be or Not to Be

I feel like I'm living in Shakespeare's Hamlet. The identity of the Methodist church and our place in it is before us in the coming months. This was the dominant issue in our discussions at the recent Annual Conference in Montgomery in June.

I know some of you have become very interested and involved in learning more about the process of disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church. These issues have even made the national news- and will probably continue to do so for the next year and a half. Is it something good? Or not good? And what are all the uncertainties which go into this.



Over the last several weeks, I've encountered a LOT of questions- I answer each as best I can. I've also heard people express a range of emotions. Some are eager to move forward into a new future. Some like things the way they are and don't want them to change. Others are just very anxious about the uncertainty that fills the day and age in which we live. I also encounter still others who know virtually nothing about all of this - but want to know more.

I understand the feelings I've encountered and I feel them myself. Uncertainty and differences of opinion can be very difficult at times. But I'm of the opinion that differences, uncertainty, and challenges will be, and are already now, upon us – whether the church acts or does nothing.

Therefore, my position as a pastor of this great church is to help provide information so that you can make the best decision you can. We have some pastors in our conference who seem to be almost intentionally not sharing any of this information with their churches. I cannot speak for them- but as for me, I want you to make the best decision for your church here in Crestview in a spirit of transparency. As I have said for months- I want you to be informed.

Consequently, there will be a called meeting of the Administrative Council for Sunday afternoon, July 31 at 3 pm in the Main Sanctuary. The purpose of this meeting will be <u>basic</u> information on the decision and process before us. There is far too much misinformation and erroneous assumptions which people hold, and so it is important that people know what we need to know and to allow a space to ask questions.

Let me be absolutely clear: this meeting on July 31 is <u>not</u> to decide whether First United Methodist of Crestview is leaving or staying... so please do not come to this meeting thinking this will be decided. "IF" (and that is a key word).... If our church decides to pursue disaffiliation, it is a <u>long</u> process with many details, costs, and procedures. All we are doing at this meeting is learning about the issues, the procedures, the timeline, and the framework for what is before us. And then to answer any basic questions which people

have. My prayer is that this would be a loving and respectful meeting.

This issue is very involved, and there is a lot to explain, so please allow at least an hour (probably a bit more). The meeting will not be streamed on the internet. I wanted to have the meeting in the afternoon on a Sunday so that as many may attend as would like. The focus of this meeting is for the members of the Administrative Council since they are the only ones who can actually vote to begin this very involved process, but as always, the meeting is open for all who would like to attend.

Since my last Newsletter, we have had our Annual Conference and there will be some things for me to report- as well as any other events in the denomination.

In the last two newsletter articles, I listed many sources of information from all sides of this debate. Please use those resources. If you need reprints, please call the church office.

As always, please pray for our church. Pray for me as pastor. Pray for our Bishop (David Graves) and our District Superintendent (Jean Tippit). Continue to love and serve Jesus as we reach others with the Good News of the Gospel.

Blessing of the Backpacks



The students will have several special water days, 2 visits from the Snow Cone truck, a fun filled week of Vacation Bible School and a special visit from Smokey the Bear.


Our staff is also working very hard to prepare for the new school year. Classes are moving rooms and themes are changing, and 2 additional VPK classes have been added for the new school year.
