Final Disaffiliation Report

As promised, this is the last Disaffiliation Report of mine for the Newsletter.

On June 8, we received the quit claim deed for our property and filed it immediately at the courthouse. This was the very final formal step in Disaffiliation. We are now 100% a Global Methodist Church.

It has been exciting to see the new signs going up around campus for parking and the direction. As I write this, new highway signs and modifications to our large sign out front are being made and will hopefully be installed by about the time you read this. Sadly, the bad storms in mid-June produced winds that were so strong, a few of our new signs were damaged. They are being repaired or replaced.

Please also be in prayer for the churches of the Alabama West Florida Conference who still hope to get out in November (about 50-80). On June 5, the Conference Board of Trustees posted a set of revised policies which, according to one of the progressive leaders of the Conference, makes it "likely that few, if any churches" will now be able to Disaffiliate. This is heartbreaking for those who genuinely want to leave. It is further disappointing that after three years, progressives are changing the rules with only a few months left in the process.

Lastly, the Al-West Florida Conference voted to discontinue the medical supplement that retired pastors receive if those pastors choose to disaffiliate. Their justification was that they have no financial obligation to pastors who leave the UMC (even if those pastors served 40 and 50 years with them). However, please note: all disaffiliating churches paid for that financial obligation- it was one of the fees we and other churches paid. So the Al-West Florida Conference charged churches a fee to leave, and then withdrew part of the reason for the fee- and is keeping the money anyway. This is very unjust and disappointing. To be honest, this has only reinforced why so many people are glad to be moving in a new direction.

A New Future

It is exciting to be a part of the Global Methodist Church now. Our new Conference is called the Alabama Emerald Coast Conference. The boundaries are the same as we had before. Our President Pro Tempore of our Conference is Dr. Lester Spencer. Since new churches are still joining every week, the district lines are still being drawn. In the future, we will announce our Presiding Elder (this is the historic position that eventually became District Superintendent). Our current Bishop is the wonderful Bishop Scott Jones.
