From the Pastor's Desk

It's Moving Time!

This is a wonderful opportunity for evangelism. I would like to encourage you to watch out for "For Sale" signs in your neighborhood and then especially watch for moving trucks.

When a family moves in, be the friendly face that welcomes them to the neighborhood. Invite them to church and answer helpful questions (like when is garbage pick-up?). In past years, I made a yummy pie for my new neighbors and delivered it in person.



For the new neighbor who is feeling very lonely (maybe even depressed from losing their old friends) or who does not know Jesus as Savior, you never know when this simple act of kindness could change a person's life.

This is a great honor and I am thankful for your support.

Update on United Methodism

This will probably be a regular part of my monthly newsletter for the time being because more information is coming out at a faster rate than before.

If you didn't get a copy of the May Newsletter, we can email you a copy or print one in the office. My article had a lot of information in that issue.

This month I wanted to let you know a few more things.

First, a few weeks ago, the Judicial Council ruled that an entire Annual Conference in the United States cannot leave the denomination (this is permissible overseas, but not here). This seemed to be a reversal of one of their previous opinions and the option is now off the table.

Furthermore, a new Methodist denomination was officially started on May 1. Called the Global Methodist Church (GMC), this new denomination is Biblical and conservative. Its goal is to move away from the more progressive pressures and contingents of the United Methodist Church and return to the best expressions of our faithful heritage. I also wanted to report that there will be some informational meetings around our conference in the next few weeks. These meetings will explain some of the legislation that will come before our Annual Conference in the middle of June and the general status of the United Methodist Church. Some of this legislation will make it much harder for any local congregation to leave the United Methodist Church. Some would make it easier. These are all serious issues which are facing our churches and I have wanted as many people as possible to enter this time period on an informed basis.

One of those meetings is near us in Niceville: June 1 at 6 pm at Crosspoint Church in Niceville. Because this may be a very crowded meeting, they are asking people to register at no cost. Go to the following website: http://movingforward.cc

Then click the Register button at the bottom. Choose the location you wish to visit (one is in Niceville, and one is in Montgomery). You would then choose "laity" if you are not a Methodist pastor. I plan to attend this meeting.

By the time you read this newsletter, June 1 will be upon us (and space may be filled)- so register as soon as you can if you are interested in attending.

Next month, I'll report to you what happens on these issues at our Annual Conference Meeting in Montgomery, June 12-16. Margaret Larson and I will be representing our church.

In the last few weeks, I've spoken to several people in our church who have done what I asked last month. They have been reading and researching information about what's going on in the United Methodist Church and the issues, options and opportunities before us. In my conversations, I've met with people who are frustrated with what they find. Others are nervous about the future and what it holds. One person said, "I don't like change!" I said, "I understand. But one way or another, change will be upon us soon or the next few years whether we like it or not."

I am very sympathetic to all these emotions people are experiencing. However, in potentially uncertain times, I know I serve a Risen Savior who loves us and will help us into a brighter future of faithfulness to Him and His Word! My desire is to lift up Jesus as Lord and King, as well faithfully share the powerful Word of God which is able to pierce even stubborn hearts.

I've also had a few people ask if we in First Methodist in Crestview have done, or plan to do anything so far. At this point, the answer is no. I have felt there was too little information available and too many uncertainties at the time. Slowly, some of those uncertainties are becoming clearer. July will certainly provide a bit more information.

So once again, as we face the future together, my desire is to have an informed congregation. Last month, I provided a lot of resources for you to look up and follow (get the May newsletter if you didn't see it).

This month I'll add two more.

In order to follow the Liberal/Progressive side of these issues, a major group is called **UMC Next**. Their website is: https://umcnext.com/ and you can see where they lay out their goals for the future of the United Methodist Church. Their goal is to radically change the church from where it stands today.
