# A Note From Pastor Ronnie

#### A Pastor's Plan

I've been asked if I would provide some updates to the situation in our denomination. Someone noted: Ronnie, you haven't spoken about it hardly at all.

And that's true. The primary reason has been that I did not feel there was anything definite and certain to talk about. A proposal called the Protocol for Reconciliation and Grace through Separation (which I support) was made years ago to divide our United Methodist denomination into two denominations: one conservative/traditional and one liberal/progressive with pathways for each pastor and congregation to get where they want to be. But it's only a proposal, and that proposal was to be discussed in 2020 at General Conference. But COVID hit and the meeting of General Conference has

The primary development that has happened in the last couple of weeks is that the largest church in our Conference has voted to leave (Frazer Church in Montgomery) as have a few others, but that leaving under current conditions comes at a significant cost in apportionment and pension liability payments. Some churches will have those resources, others will not.

In all of this time of uncertainty, I have a very definite and purposeful plan: To preach Jesus. To lift Him up as Savior and the hope for all who are broken from sin. To lift up the truth of the Word of God which is able to pierce our very hearts, to beak chains, and provide light and guidance for our way. I plan to faithfully lead the church that I love which Bishop Graves has placed in my charge.

I believe our denomination has wonderful doctrine and covenants. It deeply saddens me that we have some who have rejected our historic positions and rejected their covenant.

When there is something specific to talk about in the future, then I will keep you informed. I'm sure that by our next Administrative Board Meeting in a few weeks, we will know if General Conference will meet or be delayed again. I'll report what I find.

These discussions on a Conference and a global scale are important. But let's not let them distract us from the call to make disciples for Jesus Christ. Let's follow and serve the Lord Jesus with all we have because there are so many people right in our area who need Jesus as Savior and people who need a church home.


