From the Pastor's Desk

I have a lot to share this month.

New Mission Statement

Our Long Range Planning leaders will be presenting a new Mission statement for our church at the next Administrative Council meeting.

I had spoken to many people in our church and could not find a single person who knew our previous mission statement by heart even though it is on every Sunday bulletin. Our leaders also found it not very clear and understandable. Therefore, after a wonderful



discussion, our Long Range Planning Leaders came up with a new proposed statement. Our Mission is to:

"Lead people to Jesus through God's Word and equip them for discipleship." We believe this new statement is clear and memorable (even for children).

We wanted to highlight a few key concepts.

Jesus- He is the focus of what we do.

God's Word- especially in this day and age of relativism, the Bible should be our foundation. A root issue in the chaos in many churches is an abandonment of Biblical truth. **Equipping**- Our goal is not entertainment, but the transformation of people. We are called to make disciples and give people tools for making this happen.

A lot of good discussion went into this statement. Many good ideas were presented and it was a challenge to weed things down to a short statement. I believe the end product was a good one and I hope it is adopted.

Stained Glass Cup Project

As I write this, we are finishing up orders for the last mug (number 6 in the set). I know that people want to go back and get more of the other mugs- and soon those orders will be opening up.

A few weeks ago, we were able to send Pastor Chris about \$7,500. This came from the cup sales and from donations. He and his churches have been very active in helping Ukrainians fleeing war. Thank you for your support.

Update on United Methodism

As promised, I wanted to give you an update on the situation in our denomination. A few weeks ago, the General Conference committee made the decision to postpone General Conference for a third time and have delayed all matters until 2024 at the next regular session of General Conference. There will be no meeting in 2022 or 2023. Their reasoning was COVID safety and travel policies. They wanted to "protect and help" especially those living overseas, but the great irony is that a large African delegation strongly urged the committee to proceed with General Conference <u>this</u> year. It is reported that most of the votes to postpone came from the United States, not overseas.

Needless to say, many folks are very disappointed with this decision to postpone yet again (while many were also very happy).

Many feel the best hope and goal was for the General Conference to meet and deal with a plan called the <u>Protocol for Reconciliation and Grace through Separation</u> for an orderly division of the church. That is now delayed. Consequently, the decision was made by a group of leaders to inaugurate the Global Methodist Church as a new Biblically conservative denomination on May 1 of this year. Thus because of this delay and because the Global Methodist Church is moving forward, there is a growing a call for more conservative/Biblical/Traditional churches to look at moving to the Global Methodist Church in the near future. Some of this push is even coming from our own Annual Conference (follow here if you want to learn more: <u>https://www.facebook.com/wcaawf</u>) Will a major movement happen this year? It's too soon to tell.

Our Bishop has prepared some videos dealing with some of these issues. Bishop Graves has provided wonderful leadership during difficult times. While some Bishops around the country have acted in a punitive manner toward conservative churches, Bishop Graves has not. He has stated publicly on many occasions he respects passions on all sides of this debate and he is committed to help each church get to where they want to be. However, he has expressed the desire that the churches of the Alabama-West Florida Conference remain.

What does this mean for our church in Crestview? At this moment, some information is known and some is still developing.

The 2019 General Conference made a provision for churches that want to leave (or "disaffiliate") and be able to own their property when the dust settles (paragraph 2553 of the Discipline). However, the current process requires fees be paid which include full apportionment payments for two years. It also includes funding our church's contribution to the unfunded liability of pension payments for retired clergy. Just so that I could be accurate if anyone asked, I called the Conference Treasurer the first week of March for our amount. The amount we would have to pay up front is staggering: \$387,079.54 and the deadline for the process to be completed is Dec 31, 2023 (The benefit of passing the Protocol was that these fees would <u>not</u> need to be paid).

Some churches our size have those kinds of donors and financial resources; most others do not.

Some leaders are asserting that <u>other</u> paragraphs in the Discipline allow a congregation to leave. However, none of those procedures have been tried or validated yet. Some petitions will be presented to our Annual Conference this summer to clarify those procedures. Another short-term uncertainty relates to the entire Annual Conference. After the

announcement of General Conference postponement, the Council of Bishops directed several questions to the Judicial Council (our denomination's "supreme court"). Those questions mostly dealt with the possibility of an entire Annual Conference leaving the United Methodist Church. If the Judicial Council rules that it is indeed possible for an entire Annual Conference to withdraw, then it is possible our own Annual Conference may face this decision. This might be a way for the large fees to be avoided which are currently required under paragraph 2553.

Will General Conference bring up and pass the Protocol for Reconciliation and Grace through Separation? We will now have to wait for May of 2024 to see. I admit that I have mixed emotions, but it seems prudent to me at this time to simply wait for the next Judicial Council rulings and then see what happens at our Annual Conference this summer. In the meantime, we are still operating under a good Book of Discipline- the document which expresses our covenant for our church operations.

However, and to be very clear: as I said in my last message to the congregation, none of this will distract us from preaching the Gospel and offering life and hope to those in need through the ministries of our church. Please continue in prayer for our Bishop, our leaders, and our church.
