
FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK


May will be a big month for us!

We have moved through a wonderful time in Church Life with our big Palm Sunday gathering, Holy Week services, and our Resurrection Celebration.

Of course, May will be a big month for us.

If approved, a lot of work will begin. Our Facilities Manager, Chris Woodward and our Church Administrator, Angie Arnold, have long to-do lists. Please check with them for ways to help.



Our final cost for the Disaffiliation fees to the Annual Conference is: \$193,850. We rejoice that we have already collected about \$65,000 toward the fees for Disaffiliation- and some folks have told me they still plan to make a gift. The more we collect, the less we will borrow. We have until about July 1for payment to be made, but we will want to make that payment sooner rather than later. Almost certainly by the end of May. If you'd like to contribute, mark your checks "Disaffiliation."

Remember that on May 21, we will have a special Covenant Renewal Day with one combined service in the Main Sanctuary at 10:30 am. As we transition to the Global Methodist Church, members will all renew our membership vows. We will also have baptisms and new members join. My membership classes currently have about 23 people signed up. This will be a big day and I hope you will come and be a part of it. We are excited about the future.

Lastly for May, we always recognize those graduating. Watch the bulletin for more information.




MINISTRY UPDATES
