FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I am so thankful. My heart is overflowing.

Years ago, I was speaking to a fellow train collector in Pennsylvania. We were talking about trains, but then he said, "Ronnie, my daughter married a pastor. I had no idea what the life of a preacher was like until then." And he's right. It's an unusual and challenging calling.



And I love it. Melanie and I have been in full-time ministry for 36 years. We love people, we love our churches and we love the ministry.

But there are challenges- especially as pastoral care impacts family life. As I look back on my career, I would roughly estimate that 25-40% of all my vacations were cut short, and on rare occasion canceled, because of a death or a major surgery of a church member. Any pastor who does not have an associate pastor (which is the vast majority) has a similar experience.

For me, this is not a complaint. Because I love people and have a deep commitment to my parishioners, I want to be with them in these tough times if there is no one else to help. This was especially a challenge when I had children at home because, while I was a loving and involved father in their lives, they also knew that if it there was a planned family event and someone with cancer was rushed to surgery- I was going to be with the parishioner.

I write all of this for you, not for you to feel sorry, but in order for you to understand how thankful I am here at First Methodist. With about 400 members (and even more when counting constituents), the pastoral care needs of a church our size is large. At <u>any</u> given moment, someone could be having surgery, be in ICU or there could be a death.

And once in a while, there is a strange "perfect storm" of timing. My first year here, I was in Atlanta moving my mother-in-law when we had a death. It was

impossible for me to hop in a car and come home. Many of the staff were also gone and those who were here did a great job coping with the crisis of the funeral with the pastor away.

Melanie and I have a new grand-baby due in the coming months and will be flying up for the delivery- but I am comforted by the fact that pastoral care issues can now be met when I'm away.

I'm so thankful that a few years ago God led Tom and Edie Giovanini back to our church. Tom is a Stephen's Minister. This provides training in pastoral care situations. Tom and Edie work together help me to look after our shut-ins. They call, visit, and have taken communion to them. They have also helped me when I had two surgeries to attend in different hospitals on the same day and could not be in two places at once.

Edie heads up our Bereavement Team and leads a wonderful and dedicated group of volunteers who graciously provide meals after a funeral. Tom and Edie are a great blessing to our church.

I am also thankful for two pastors who are a part of the life of our church who will also be able to assist with pastoral care. For example, if I'm out of town, each of these could conduct a funeral and provide care for a family. You may also see them visiting for a surgery.

Many of you already know Reverend Dr. Mike Peyton. He and his wife Marianne began attending our church in 2022 and joined when we became a Global Methodist Church. Mike is ordained and a retired Navy chaplain. After military service he worked as a Hospice chaplain and pastored churches in Florida. For a long time, he was commuting all the way to Miramar Beach working for hospice, but recently he joined the team of Emerald Coast Hospice here in Crestview.

Mike teaches a Sunday School class in the Asbury Room at the Crossroads Center at 9:45. He then finishes class and rushes to the choir room to join the choir at the 11 o'clock service. He has already preached for me when I was away, so I hope you have gotten to meet him.

More recently, we have welcomed Reverend Kathy McKinley and her husband Mac (Mac is one of our recent new members). They moved to Crestview in 1984 when Mac was stationed at Eglin. Some time later, Kathy felt called into the ministry and served as a United Methodist pastor for 22 years serving churches in Alabama. Kathy retired from the UMC this June and then joined the Global Methodist Church. She was ordained an Elder in the GMC at the first meeting of the new Alabama Emerald Coast Conference and we are excited to have her here.

You are already getting to know Kathy because she is also helping as liturgist on some Sundays, and on those days, I look out and see her greeting people before and after the service.

Being a retired pastor, Kathy has graciously agree to help me with surgeries on Fridays on a rotating basis. Having a true day off is a challenge for a pastor because (as I sometimes lightheartedly say) physicians don't consult the pastor's schedule when doing surgeries. So Kathy and I have set up alternating Fridays when one of us will be on call for someone having surgery (and other times as needed). This is such a big help to me.

So, I am very grateful for the loving help these people have offered. It's a blessing to both me and the congregation. I am also so grateful for such a wonderful staff. I hope you know, almost any of the office staff would be able to talk and pray with someone who came up to the church during the week.

One last thing. Words cannot express the gratitude Melanie and I feel from Pastor Appreciation month in October. Your gifts, cards, meals, and expressions of love have been tremendous. Melanie and I truly know that we are loved at this church. You are such a blessing.
