The Next Phase of Re-opening

Dear Church Family,

It has been so very good to see a few more people each week come back to in-person worship. These have been challenging days, and I have truly missed you.

The COVID numbers for our county have been doing better. We had a spike in infections in July and partially into August. But that has dropped and has not spiked with school starting (one of our main concerns). Given these numbers, our leaders feel we can move to our next incremental phase.

Our COVID Task Force leaders have set October as the start date for resuming some in-person activities at the church. COVID precautions will still be in place.

I have a sense from some people that the concern for COVID should now be passed. While things are MUCH better than they were in March and April, the concern is still presentespecially for older people and those with serious health issues.

Remember that Warrior Creek Missionary Baptist Church in north Alabama had a COVID crisis several weeks ago. The church normally worships with about 80-100. They held revival services during the pandemic and social distancing, shaking hands and masks were a bit loose in their practice. And as a result, 40 people came down from COVID at those church gatherings. This is exactly the kind of event we are trying to avoid.

We are trying to be wise. We have been open for worship since June, and we are trying to move forward incrementally as conditions warrant.

Sunday School resumes October 4 for those classes who wish to meet. We will still be practicing social distancing which means that some classes need to be moved to a larger room. Those assignments have not been made as of this writing and will go out be email and notices will be posted on the doors.

We know that some people may not feel comfortable returning, and we understand and support you.

It would be helpful for our office staff if we knew which classes will plan to meet, and which will

Wednesday Night Activities will resume partially on Wednesday October 7. I say partially because the activities will be limited to children and youth for in-person meeting.

This means that adult small groups will start inperson meeting at a later date. And there's a reason for this.

Our thinking is that we want to move forward incrementally. Right now, the next phase to is have a full house on Sunday (with both Sunday School and Worship). But we do not want to jump to a full house two times a week. So getting our children and youth back to meeting is the higher priority.

A few larger weekly groups (outside of Wednesday) that have been unable to meet (like scouting) will now also resume.

<u>Items for a Future Phase</u> (not resuming at present)

<u>Small Groups on Wednesday</u> will resume later, as discussed above.

Early Worship. A lot of people have been asking about the 8:30 service. We are not resuming that service yet. I know that will be disappointing news to some, but we are trying to regulate our increase in activities incrementally. If you love Traditional worship, we encourage you to attend at 11 for now, as some are doing.

And let me say clearly again. I am committed to resuming early worship some day- and consider it an important part of our ministry.

CommUNITY Dinners. I look forward to seeing everyone when we can meet again for CommUNITY Dinners.

Typical Funerals with Meals. Around the country, funerals have been places where COVID is spread- there are many examples. Therefore, we will continue to use the same COVID restrictions for worship. Our church is also not providing a meal at this time.

We thus ask your continued patience and support as we move through these challenging days.

Thank you for your faithfulness and positive spirit during these days.
