From the Pastor's Desk

Discernment

On Oct 28, our Administrative Council voted to Explore Disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. Therefore, this is a time in our church life which requires discernment.

I want to briefly repeat and expand upon my message last month.

– Seek Jesus. In all things. Seek His heart and His will. Spend time in the Word of God.



– Be Informed. Do a lot reading and researching. There is a lot of information on all sides of the Disaffiliation issue. I've provided resources and there are a whole lot more out there. I've been impressed by the research I have seen by some of our folks.

 Pray. Seeking Jesus and being informed will place you in a better position to pray. Pray for yourself. Pray for others in our church. Pray for attitudes in a time of disagreement.

– Envision. Based on what you are reading and seeing, where will the United Methodist Church be in 5 years or 10... or even 20? Where will our church be? Based on what you are discovering, will our church be more effective inside or outside the UMC? And most important, where does God want us to be?

– Attend Townhall meetings. That way you are a full part of what's going on and are much more aware of the issues and the thinking of our church members. In particular:

– Listen. Each one who wants to share should be respected and heard. We should be patient with each other.

- Share. You yourself should consider sharing your views. You never know who else is thinking exactly as you. It is in the sharing that people get a sense of the overall leading of the congregation.

- Love. As has been pointed out in previous meetings, our church has had

differences in the past. Our goal is to move through this time in a spirit of respectful love.


Small Group Reminders:

<u>A Friendly Reminder</u>

This year the General Election for Governor & Lt Governor, U.S. House of Representatives, U.S. Senate, State Attorney General & State Commissioner of Agriculture will take place NOVEMBER 8, 2022. Elections matter! It is vital that Christians stand up and vote for candidates who will fight for the citizens of this country. During the August Primary in our county less than 30% of the registered voters participated.



Approximately 42,900 people made the decisions for the approximately 208,000 residents of Okaloosa County (only approximately 143,000 are even registered to vote.) If we have seen anything in the last few years WHO is in these offices is critical to the well-being of our local area--not just the nation. LOTS of out-of-state money is being poured into Florida to influence our state elections. Look into the candidates and look at how incumbents voted while in office...did they stand up for citizens or not? If a candidate is not an incumbent see what their careers have been...do they profess to be a Christian? Have they had a career where you can see what their values are?

If you do not know if you are registered you may check your status here: <u>Florida</u> <u>Online Voter Registration System (registertovoteflorida.gov)</u> If you are NOT registered you may register at that same link or you may download a form to print and submit here: <u>Register to Vote (govote-okaloosa.com)</u>

YOU MUST REGISTER by October 11th to vote on November 8th. There is early voting that will available October 24th through November 5th. <u>Vote Early</u> (govote-okaloosa.com) . And Vote by Mail is also an option in the State of Florida...you must request a Vote by Mail Ballot no later than October 29th.

Another big need for the election is a need for Poll Workers for the day of the election. Poll workers must attend one training class but there is a nominal payment for training and working the Election Day Polls. More information can be found here: <u>Poll Workers (govote-okaloosa.com)</u>. If you have any questions and don't want to call the election office, call me!

If you have problems with any aspect of participating in the election please contact me!! I will find out how to help. If you have a problem getting to the polls contact me! I'll help you get there. We have a great Election Supervisor who runs a tight ship. If you have any questions call his office at 850-689-5600 or visit: Okaloosa County Supervisor of Elections > Home (govote-okaloosa.com). Or call me, at 505-553-9498. There are so many issues in our country right now...let's do our part to make sure we keep our small part of it the way we like it! May God Bless America. An All Saints Day Devotion

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." Hebrews 12:1

Those To Glory Gone

All Saints Day is an opportunity to give thanks for those who have gone before us in the faith. It is a time to celebrate our history, what United Methodists call the tradition of the church.

From the early days of Christianity, there is a sense that the Church consists of not only all living believers, but also all who have gone before us. For example, in Hebrews 12 the author encourages Christians to remember that a "great cloud of witnesses" surrounds us encouraging us, cheering us on.

Charles Wesley, John's brother, picks up on this theme in his hymn that appears in our United Methodist Hymnal as "Come, Let Us Join our Friends Above," #709. In the first verse, he offers a wonderful image of the Church through the ages:

Let saints on earth unite to sing, with those to glory gone,

for all the servants of our King in earth and heaven, are one.

On All Saints Day we can remember all those who are part of the "communion of saints" we confess whenever we recite The Apostles' Creed. We share stories of those "to glory gone."

Retelling these stories grounds us in our history. These memories teach us how God has

provided for us through the generosity and sacrifice of those who have come before us. The stories of the saints encourage us to be all God has created us to be.

Saints On Earth

Charles Wesley's hymn tells us those "to glory gone" are joined by the "saints on earth." We think of the inspirational people with whom we worship on Sunday, and those across the world we will never meet.
