<u>Dear Church Family,</u>

Here are few updates:

1. COVID trends and Plans

I watch the weekly statistics for our county, and after a spike in July and early August, the trends are leveled off or headed downward. This is good news, especially as our schools are opening up. Our tentative plan has been to re-start Sunday school, children's activities and youth meetings around the end of September. We will keep you posted as we near that time. Our decision will be based on watching the COVID stats and trends for our area.

2. Worship In-Person and Online

We continue to hold in-person worship at 9:45 and 11. Attendance at 9:45 is about 35-50, and the attendance is about 65-80. We continue to have over 100 people watching online each week- with more viewers watching a recording later.

Many people are not ready to return to in-person worship yet- and we understand and support you. Others are very glad we are meeting and appreciate "seeing and being seen."

As to the future, it is still too soon to know when we will "get back to normal." Some items in particular that are being delayed are a choir at 11 o'clock and resuming the 8:30 service. For those

It is still months away, but our Christmas celebrations may look a little different this year. For example, the Christmas musical may be a bit different as well as the Christmas Eve service (since Christmas Eve is traditionally a very crowded service with 300-400 in the last few years, we are exploring doing two services this year).

Our Sunday online experience is better but still has some challenges. We have most of the issues worked out on our end, but we have been having some trouble with Facebook itself. For example, on August 23, we were streaming the 9:45 service and all was well. Then about 19 minutes in, just about as the sermon was starting, the connection to Facebook was lost. We had to re-connect and I know that was frustrating to viewers. Since churches all across the country are streaming at roughly the same time on Sunday mornings, we are wondering if Facebook is having bandwidth problems.

For those of you that watch online, we are exploring other streaming services hoping for better reliability. We will not do anything suddenly and will advertise well in advance if and when we make a change.

3. Youth Minister Search

I am happy to report that our church has hired a youth minister as of the day I'm writing this right at our newsletter deadline! It has been an extensive search with many applications and several people interviewed. It has been a time-consuming process and I'm grateful to all those involved in the interviewing and hiring process.

We welcome Paul Adams to our staff. I will introduce him on Sunday Aug 30. We will also be making a post to Facebook and sending out email. His official start date will be Monday, Aug 31.

We look forward to hearing more about and from Paul in the days ahead.

4. Online Devotions

First Light devotions continue with a weekday schedule. I've shortened them slightly. There are no plans at present to change this.

Into the Stained Glass is nearing the final stretch. Instead of a particular schedule, they are now "ready when they are ready" - meaning I work on them when I can. I hope to have episode 15 ready soon. In all, I've mapped out about 24 episodes in all. At the conclusion of this process, we also hope to produce a DVD with all 24 episodes as well as a printed booklet. We pray that all of this work is a blessing and brings to life our wonderful stained glass.


