### **Covid Update**

The latest wave of Covid seems to be hitting our area pretty hard. Our hospitals are having a tough time. Please keep them in your prayers.

We've had a few possible exposures at church over the last few weeks. As we have done before, any groups having a possible exposure have been notified.

Because of the number of cases in Crestview, we are at a point that you are at risk of exposure anywhere you go in public- like grocery shopping, gas stations, and church is no different. If you are in a higher risk group, I know you will continue to make the best decisions for yourself including vaccinations and the activities in which you participate.

Our online worship broadcasts are here to stay as long as we have volunteers to make it happen (currently, we could use a few more volunteerslet me know if you would like to help).

At present, I am not willing to lockdown the whole church again as far as worship is concerned. The toll of the previous lockdown was huge. People's emotional health and spiritual health are at play as well- not just their bodies.

But I <u>am</u> encouraging people to not shake hands and to practice more social distancing. We're also asking groups to not over-crowd a room.

Because groups and classes by nature provide closer contact, we may from time to time close an event for a week. This could include activities with children, youth, or the office.

Also, because of the nature of Holy Communion, I'm going to pause it for September. I'll reevaluate in mid September.

Be faithful to the Lord, continuing to love and serve Him.

Be respectful of each other and honor the best decisions that people need to make for themselves.

# Life Line Screening
