Revised COVID Policy

Based on recent CDC changes in guidelines and the status of COVID in our area, the Long Range Planning Committee has decided that most of our COVID procedures are discontinued.

Two exceptions will be that we will continue to do Holy Communion the way we've been doing it in the last few months and the Offering/Grace Notes will continue to be collected at the end of the service at the exits. Masks and hand sanitizer will continue to be available to all at the entrances to worship for those who wish them

We do have two requests as we move into this next phase.

Please Be Responsible. Make attendance and behavior decisions that are best for you. And as always, if you are not feeling well, please watch worship online and do not risk spreading anything at church.

Please Be Respectful. Some people will wish to continue to wear masks and we encourage them to do so if they like. Others will not wear a mask. Let's respect people in the decisions which make them feel the most comfortable.

And as always, our policies may change in the future as conditions warrant.

Furthermore, as we've stated many times before, Online Worship Ministry is here to stay! The Well Service at 9:45 and the Traditions Service at 11:00 will continue to be streamed Live online on Facebook.

The early service will return to the Chapel on June 6. We will also shift back to 8:30 AM once we are in the Chapel (so remember to keep coming at 8:15 through the month of May).

Food Drop Round-up

To our Church Family,

Last fall, our friend Sam Field tried to arrange a Food Distribution event for our community on a couple of different dates. They were not able to work the original dates in the fall, and finally settled on a date in January 2021. Sam made all the arrangements, but by the time of the event, he had fallen ill and was not able to make it to the event. His coordination and the efforts of our church family led to the event going off so well it was repeated 3 more times this spring. The people of the Crestview First United Methodist Church stepped up to

fill the void when we lost Sam, and through their efforts between Jan and May 2021 we were able to distribute 40,000 pounds of donated grocery items to over 1,000 families in our community.

To everyone who helped, whether you parked cars, bagged groceries, registered people, loaded cars, broke down boxes, prepared tables for moving to the site, called grocery bag manufacturers trying to find us less expensive bags, passed on word to your neighbors who might be in need, created colorful fliers, loaned us a trailer last minute, brought family members out at the crack of dawn on a Saturday, came out in the rain, THANK YOU! This effort never would have been possible without the assistance from all the people who were involved, no matter what the job was. Each of you has the gift of a servant's heart. Thank you for all the help and support. Y'all did Sam proud.
